## Risk Rating Method

Risk Rating = Severity x Likelihood

Tolerable/Low Moderate/Medium Intolerable/High

0 – 4 | Tolerable/Low

No Current Action Required

5 – 14 | Moderate/Medium

Implement Controls where Practicable to Reduce the Risk Further

15 – 25 | Intolerable/High

Stop the Task Immediately & Implement Controls until a Rating of at Least Moderate/Medium is Achieved

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
